The Arts in America's Heartland: Kansas City & Crystal Bridges

Dear Members and Friends of The Metropolitan Museum of Art,

With an abundance of extraordinary museums and exceptional private collections, Kansas City, Missouri, beckons every art lover to come and explore. Two hundred miles south, Bentonville, Arkansas does so too, thanks to the visionary Alice Walton and her worldrenowned Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art. This new and celebrated museum enthralls visitors with its marvelous interweaving of art, architecture, and nature, designed by Moshe Safdie in the middle of the Ozarks.

Please join me this fall to experience this splendid array of art, architecture, and landscape in America's heartland. As a longtime museum educator whose specialty is looking closely at works of art, I am excited to savor, share, and discover with you a selection of the many masterpieces we'll encounter.

Our program begins with three nights in Kansas City. Accompanied by curators, we will gain behind-the-scenes access to several of the city's exceptional art spaces, including the well-preserved home and studio of the Missouri-born artist Thomas Hart Benton, as well as the epoch-spanning galleries of the vast Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art. We will also privately explore the striking Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, viewing masterpieces from artists including Pollock, Rauschenberg, and Johns. A highlight will be a special visit to Harry S. Truman's hometown of Independence, Missouri, and his recently renovated Presidential Library.

Then we will venture south for a two-night stay in Bentonville, including a full-day, curator-led tour of Crystal Bridges. With its glass pavilions surrounded by tranquil ponds, the museum's beauty is matched by the superb American art on display, including works by Georgia O'Keeffe, Norman Rockwell, and others. The museum's campus is equally captivating, encompassing 120 acres of native Ozark forest and five miles of walking trails. Here, we'll find some of the museum's most enchanting works, including outdoor sculptures, a site-specific installation from James Turrell, and Frank Lloyd Wright's Bachman-Wilson House, a fine example of his "Usonian" style of architecture, which was relocated here from its original New Jersey home in 2013.

Mid-autumn in Missouri and Arkansas promises pleasant, mild weather, a perfect time of year in which to immerse ourselves in American art against a backdrop of pine forests and natural springs. I hope you join me for this profoundly enriching cultural experience in the Midwest.

Traveling with You Rika Burnham

Rika Burnham is a leading theorist and practitioner of art museum gallery teaching. Author of Teaching in the Art Museum: Interpretation as Experience, and lecturer at Columbia University, she has served as Head of Education at The Frick Collection. Museum Educator at The Metropolitan Museum of Art, Project Director for TIME/Teaching Institute in Museum Education at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, and was appointed Getty Research Institute Museum Scholar in 2002 and 2018. She holds a degree in art history from Harvard University and was awarded the degree of Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts from Massachusetts College of Art and Design in 2014.

- Enjoy curatorial tours in Kansas City of the encyclopedic collections of the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, where you will have a close look at its European masterpieces, old and new; and the Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, featuring art by Georgia O'Keeffe, Hans Hofmann, Rashid Johnson, and others
- Meet a curator for a special day-long tour of the Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art, enjoying a close look at an American masterpiece and exploring the museum's 120-acre Ozark campus, its outdoor sculptures, and a site-specific installation by James Turrell
- Go backstage at the Moshe Safdie-designed Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts, which boasts arches inspired by the rolling plains of Kansas and Missouri
- Venture to Independence, Missouri, for a special inside look at the Harry S. Truman
 Presidential Library & Museum, which has recently undergone a \$29 million renovation
- Step back in time on a guided visit to the home of Thomas Hart Benton, noted painter and Missouri native, whose on-site studio is virtually untouched since his death



Wednesday, November 1

Delight in a private morning visit to the Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, Missouri's largest contemporary art museum. Discover its collection bridging the gap between modern and contemporary art, featuring artworks by the likes of Louise Bourgeois, Helen Frankenthaler, Hans Hofmann, Rashid Johnson, Joan Mitchell, Richard Mosse, Willem de Kooning, and Georgia O'Keeffe. Later this afternoon, take a behind-the-scenes excursion to the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts. This magnificent building in downtown Kansas City was designed by architect Moshe Safdie, who also designed the Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art. This evening, dinner is at leisure. B, L

Thursday, November 2

Our day begins with a curatorial visit to the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, which houses more than 35,000 works of art ranging from ancient Greek sculptures to outstanding modern and contemporary pieces by Paul Klee, Pablo Picasso, Andy Warhol, Donald Judd, and other artists. Lunch is at leisure. Then visit the beautifully preserved house and studio of Thomas Hart Benton (1889-1975), the Missouri-born muralist and painter who was known as one of the founders of American Regionalism. Benton vividly captured scenes of U.S. life, family, and history in his art, and you will have an exclusive look at his creative process. Enjoy dinner at a local favorite this evening. B. D

You may also enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure to admire the charming, rapidly growing Ozark town of Bentonville. B.I

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

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
